Milestones and Recommended Actions - CSC:

- Consider Summer Courses: Summer courses at CSC can help accelerate your time to transfer, and help you stay on track. Talk to your advisor about planning summer courses.
- During or After Year One at CSC: Consider a campus tour of Northeastern State University and connect with a NSU academic advisor, to ensure you are on track to transfer. Your CSC academic advisor can assist in planning these actions.
- During Year Two at CSC: After semester three coursework, apply for admission at Northeastern State University
 as a transfer student (https://apply.nsuok.edu/).
- Final Semester at CSC: Congratulations you are about to earn your Associate degree. Be sure to apply for graduation.
- Transcripts: submit official CSC transcript to NSU.



SMART CHOICE

- Reverse Transfer: If you have not earned an Associate in Arts or an Associate in Science from CSC, and have completed 60 credit hours, with 15 of those hours completed at CSC, check to see if you qualify for a degree through the Reverse Transfer program.
- Stay Connected: After graduating from Connors, you can still stay connected to Connors through the alumni program. Check the website (https://connorsstate.edu/) for more information.

Program Information and Recommended Actions - NSU: In addition to courses in the discipline, all students completing a BA or BS in Education degree must meet the following requirements for certification.

- Be accepted for admission to teacher education, pre-II internship, and full internship according to published course sequence and guidelines.
- Demonstrate proficiency at the high novice level in a language other than English.
- Complete all courses in the major and Professional Education Core with a grade of "C" or higher.
- Students entering NSU beginning Fall 2013 must have an overall GPA of 2.75 for admission to teacher education.
- Once admitted to the teacher education program, all majors must continue to maintain a GPA of 2.5 (overall and in their major field of study) through completion.
- 4 X 12 requirement Early Childhood, Elementary Education, and **Special Education** programs require completion of 12 semester hours with a grade of "C" or better in the following disciplines: Communication Arts (English, Communication, Literature), Math, Science, and Social Science (Economics, Geography, History, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology) prior to graduation.
- All Professional Education majors must complete PSYC 1003 or PSYC 1113. Advisors recommend those courses be completed as part of the General Education course seguence.

Baccalaureate Degree Information:

- Students must complete 60 of 124 credit hours from a university (four-year school), excluding physical education courses.
- 30 credit hours are required from NSU.
- 40 credit hours must be junior and senior (3000/4000) level courses.
- At least 18 hours or 50% of the major, whichever is greater, must be from NSU; half the major must be upper level (3000/4000).
- English proficient (ENGL 1113 Composition & ENGL 1213 Composition II) with a C or better.
- Computer proficient.

Accelerated Degree Program (ADP)

- Students may take some Special Education courses at the graduate level to get a head start on a Special Education Autism Spectrum Disorders, M. Ed. Degree
 - # SPED 4223 = SPED 5203, SPED 4253 = SPED 5323, SPED 4242 = SPED 5812, SPED 4263 = SPED 5263 can count for Masters in SPED but must be taken at the graduate level.

- Semester 5 Apply to NSU Graduate College for M.Ed. Special Education-Autism Spectrum Disorders degree
- Semester 6 Maintain 3.0 GPA & 72 completed hours to enroll in graduate courses as ADP student
